Firstly, Chinese espionage is corporate espionage - spying not on American governments but corporations -because of (1) China's expanding role as a financial superpower, and (2) that being where a country's true political will lies. There's actually little overlap between Chinese and Western espionage. For one, the Chinese don't pay for intelligence. They believe people would never knowingly commit espionage, but would instead be indiscreet under the right circumstances. China is not looking to recruit spies as much as "good people" willing to gossip and help China modernize. And with the unfettered travel back and forth into China, these gossips are recruited by China's top spy agency, the Ministry of State Security (MSS) while visiting the country.
